Dear Dr. Haas and Members of the Albemarle County School Board,

As parents, educators, and public school stakeholders, we are seeking a truly inclusive school system; one that, in the words of Albemarle County Public Schools' <u>Anti-Racism Policy</u>, is committed to "eliminating inequitable practices and cultivating the unique gifts, talents, and interests of every child to end the predictive value of social or cultural factors, such as race, class, or gender, on student success." We are grateful for your leadership in this endeavor.

The two biggest gaps between our shared aspiration and our experiences and observations are: (1) ongoing disparities between racial groups in student academic performance, achievement, participation in academic programs, and discipline; and, (2) the extent to which our schools feel welcoming and inclusive for students and families of color and LGBTQIA+ students and families.

We, the undersigned members of the Albemarle County Public Schools community, are writing to express our strong support for:

- Tools that support educators in implementing the ACPS <u>Anti-Racism Policy</u> including professional development in culturally responsive practices;
- Implementation of classroom materials and instruction such as J.T. Henley Middle School's <u>Courageous Conversations</u>; and,
- Adoption of the ACPS *Policy on the Treatment of Transgender and Gender Expansive Students in Schools.*

Like you, we believe that "educators play a vital role in reducing racism and inequity by recognizing the manifestations of racism, creating culturally inclusive learning and working environments, and dismantling educational systems that directly or indirectly perpetuate racism and privilege through teaching, policy, and practice." (*Anti-Racism Policy*)

We believe that these ambitious policies must now be coupled with the development of instructional practices that will bring these policies to life. That is why we support a district-wide commitment to both the training of teachers and administrators in culturally responsive teaching practices and to the selection and use of "curriculum and instructional materials for all grades [that] reflect cultural and racial diversity and include a range of perspectives and experiences, particularly those of historically underrepresented groups of color." (*Anti-Racism Policy*) Requests to censor lessons and materials based on a perceived "inappropriateness" of subject matter are very concerning, particularly after these resources have already been deemed age-appropriate for classroom use according to ACPS *Learning Resources Policy (IIAA)*.

Most families and teachers are excited to see new, more honest conversations and lessons about race and our difficult history regarding race. We cannot teach honestly about racism if we do not also acknowledge the ways in which all aspects of our identities work together to form our perspectives and experiences. For this to happen, educators must engage in ongoing development of culturally responsive instructional practices and they must have the authority

and autonomy to select supplemental materials that recognize, affirm, and celebrate every single member of their classroom communities.

According to the <u>Virginia Department of Education</u>, "Every Virginia student, regardless of their gender identity, gender expression, or sexual orientation, has a right to learn free from discrimination and harassment." A <u>national survey by GLSEN</u> has found that 84% of transgender youth feel unsafe at school, had significantly lower GPAs than their cisgender peers, were more likely to miss school out of concern for their safety, and were less likely to plan on continuing their education. More than fifty percent of transgender and non-binary youth seriously considered suicide in the past year (<u>The Trevor Project's National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health 2020</u>). It is imperative that we create school environments in which LGBTQIA+ students feel safe, supported, and free to express themselves openly.

Pursuant to §22.1-23.3 of the Code of Virginia, Albemarle County Public Schools must adopt policies, procedures, and practices for an inclusive school environment for LGBTQIA+ students prior to the start of the 2021-2022 school year. In fact, Albemarle County Public Schools has already expressed a commitment to creating an inclusive curriculum that represents the diversity in identities that make up our community. To do so, current school practices must be amended to ensure that the ACPS <u>Equity Education Policy (IGAK)</u> and the <u>Equal Educational Opportunities Policy (JB)</u>, which offer enhanced inclusion of LGBTQIA+ youth, are consistently applied and enforced.

There is a common misconception that race, bias, and LGBTQIA+ topics must be relegated to advisory lessons and the Family Life Education curriculum, so that parents may opt their children out of these conversations. The reality is that as long as there are BIPOC and LGBTQIA+ people in our schools and communities, these conversations will occur naturally and spontaneously throughout the school day. There is no model for inclusivity and culturally responsive teaching that permits those identities and topics to remain separated and siloed. We must have faith in our educators to do their jobs of developing classroom communities, teaching students empathy and social emotional learning, and answering questions in age-appropriate, supportive ways.

Therefore, parents of children in Albemarle County Public Schools should not be given the option to opt out of critical lessons such as Henley's *Courageous Conversations*. Allowing families to opt out of lessons that make them uncomfortable would undermine the professional decision-making of your staff and send a powerful message of exclusion to families of color and to LGBTQIA+ students and families. To permit parents to opt out on the basis of religious beliefs that deny the existence of transgender and non-binary individuals would be a violation of the 2020 <u>Virginia Values Act</u>, which prevents discrimination against LGBTQIA+ individuals in public spaces, including public schools.

It is the moral imperative and the duty of Albemarle County Public Schools to uphold their commitment to equity and inclusion in all ACPS schools through the development of culturally responsive educators, the implementation of an anti-racism curriculum such as Henley's

Courageous Conversations, and through the adoption and enforcement of the *Policy on the Treatment of Transgender and Gender Expansive Students in Schools*.
